












I am writing this note from our sister school in the Dominican Republic, as in August 2000 I ended my tenure as NHA/MWA Program Director. I enjoyed the opportunities and the challenges during my seven years in that role.

Yearbooks are for memories. Some of my memories include the mud wrestling in the summer of 2000 in front of GBSB, vacating my home to allow my wife and the female staff to have "sleep-overs," going to lots of staff weddings, spending New Years Eve at the Memorial Coliseum in Ft. Wayne to watch and cheer at the Comets hockey game, and going to Indiana Beach the week after MWA. However, one of my best memories of these two years was how many students became really fired up in their enthusiasm for the Lord Jesus Christ. John's work with the "CRASH" club really helped facilitate this. I realized it most strongly during the spring 2000 retreat when about one-third of the student body got up out of their seats spontaneously and unbidden during a worship time and went forward to the altar to pray and worship.

As I reflect back on 1998-2000, I recall many comments from staff and students alike, on the many rules and the structure that we all had to follow. I took my approach to rules (and structure) from Christ's teaching. In Matthew 22:35 "One of them, an expert in the law, tested him with this question: (36) "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" (37) Jesus replied: "Love the Lord you God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.'* (38) This is the first and greatest commandment. (39) And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'* (40) All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." The point I am making hinges on verse 40, "All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." Structure and rules at their deepest level need to be developed and applied on the basis of love.

It is my prayer that those staff and students at NHA/MWA and indeed throughout NHYM during these two years will have experienced the love of Christ and will in turn devote their lives to, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind...(and) Love your neighbor as yourself."










Here at TKB we are like a family. Even though we don't always get along we stick together through the good times and the bad. It does get intense sometime, but its alright living on top of the hill.






A Dream Realized


